Good Neighbors is an international humanitarian development NGO founded in Korea in 1991. It was granted General Consultative Status from the United Nations Economic and Social Council (UN ECOSOC). To make the world a place without hunger, where people live together in harmony, we work in 49 countries with our focus on community development projects to protect children's rights and encourage the self-reliance of communities.

Good Neighbors USA is a registered nonprofit 501(c)(3) organization in California and has been operating in the United States since 2008 to support people in need, both locally and internationally. We primarily focus on 1:1 Child Sponsorship and Project Sponsorship with partner countries to bring about tangible changes in the lives of children and their communities. We believe that for a child to become self-resilient, her family, school, and community must change. Therefore, we conduct projects in six focus areas: education, health & nutrition, water & sanitation, income generation, advocacy, and emergency relief, to make these changes come to life.





EDUCATION



Education Project is dedicated to advocating children's rights to equal access to education. It aims to support individuals who are less likely to receive a standard education by equipping them with basic literacy skills such as reading, writing, and numeracy, which are essential for a professional future.

Improve educational environment by providing water facilities and school materials

In 2023, a significant project was implemented in Chad, focusing on enhancing the educational environment by providing water facilities and school materials to Hope schools. This project aimed to create a comfortable and safe learning environment for students. As a result, **4,329 beneficiaries**, **3 water towers were repaired**, and **160 school materials were distributed to students**. These improvements have enabled students to concentrate more on their studies, fostering a better educational experience. Table benches, cabinets, and office tables were gifted to students for them to use. These school furnitures made going to school and studying a lot easier and helped have a better school environment.



Good Neighbors understands that sustainable development is closely associated with economic empowerment. Lifting communities out of poverty requires a pathway to various income generation activities. These initiatives offer training, resources, and support to help families start small businesses, such as farming or handicrafts, enabling them to earn a sustainable income.

Improve quality of life by practicing sustainable agriculture

In Malawi, many people including children, work in agriculture. However, due to recent climate changes, grain production has drastically decreased, making it difficult to make a sustainable living by selling crops. With Good Neighbors agricultural training, locals are increasing their yields while also preserving the environment.

WATER AND SANITATION





In Niger, Good Neighbors supported the construction of a solar water tower and water tank with two water stands, each supplied with six water taps. Through this project, **1,552 people (764 men** and 788 women) benefited, with 95% gaining access to clean drinking water and 75% gaining access to improved hygiene and sanitation environments.


Good Neighbors implements water and sanitation projects to improve sanitary environments for children and the community. In 2023, we built water pumps in Niger and Zambia to provide drinking water, organized water committees to educate the maintenance of pumps, and performed water quality checks for a sustainable management of clean water supply in communities.

Promote awareness on safe hygiene and sanitation environment



In Zambia, **246** recurring and one time Water and Sanitation project donors collectively supported **2,090 beneficiaries** in six different villages. With wells located near their homes, children do not have to travel for hours to retrieve water, which allows them to attend school.

HEALTH AND NUTRITION



Good Neighbors health program is dedicated to improving the health status and environments of children and community members. This program provides integrated support aimed at enhancing the physical, mental, emotional, and social well-being of individuals. Through these comprehensive efforts, Good Neighbors ensures that both children and community members receive the necessary resources and care to lead healthier, more fulfilling lives.

Strengthening sustainable school feeding program

In 2023, Good Neighbors efforts in Guatemala focused on promoting smart food choices, equipping families with the knowledge and skills necessary for critical thinking about diet and health. This initiative encouraged families to make healthier food choices and sustain themselves by cultivating gardens with the necessary supplies.

As a result of this project, **412 mothers and children** benefited, and **75% of mothers with children under 6 years of age** attended workshops to improve their understanding of nutrition for their children and families.



Good Neighbors recognizes the importance of ensuring that families make healthy food choices, educating the essential nutrition for the wellbeing and development of children. By equipping parents and guardians with adequate knowledge and critical thinking skills regarding diet and health, they can effectively guide their families toward healthier eating habits. Their involvement is vital in helping children understand and develop healthy habits related to proper nutrition and overall health.



Our mission is to empower parents and guardians with the knowledge and skills they need to make informed dietary choices, fostering a culture of health-conscious families. Through our programs and initiatives, we aim to support and enhance parental engagement in nutrition education, contributing to a healthier future for our communities.

EMERGENCY RELIEF

WOMEN AND CHILDREN SHELTER



Helping those affected by the earthquake in Türkiye-Syria

In 2023, during the Türkiye-Syria earthquake, Good Neighbors provided emergency supplies to **1,970 households,** supporting a total of **36,983 people**. Additionally, with donations from BLACKYAK & NAU, Good Neighbors was able to send a 40-foot container of clothing to local organizations actively aiding refugees in Türkiye and Ukraine. Furthermore, Good Neighbors extended support to extremely poor families in the Philippines, addressing their basic needs. The objective of this project is to provide essential consumption support and create opportunities for these families to achieve economic self-sufficiency.

In 2017, Good Neighbors opened an emergency shelter/transitional housing facility for victims of domestic violence in Los Angeles. The establishment of the shelter was in response to the large proportion of women who were becoming homeless because they were fleeing abusive homes.


In any given year, Good Neighbors serves approximately 123 women and children in Los Angeles who are fleeing their abusers. We provide participants with a comprehensive spectrum of basic needs, recovery, and self-sufficiency services including emergency shelter, transitional housing, financial assistance to pay rent/mortgage/lease, meals, personal hygiene products, transportation, case management, as well as housing stabilization and supportive services.



HOPE LETTER


In 2023, Good Neighbors started the Hope Letter program to raise awareness among students in the USA about global living conditions. Through the Hope Letters, we promote values of empathy and altruism, fostering a profound sense of interconnectedness and a commitment to positive global change. In collaboration with the Korean School Association of America (KOSAA), Good Neighbors organized the Hope Letter contest across 42 schools, involving 4,000 student participants in letter writing. This program aims to instill a sense of global responsibility and empathy. Our target audiences were students from 1st-12th grade and parents that are in their 30-40s.



During 2023, Good Neighbors partnered with 40 churches across 8 states (Georgia, Texas, Hawaii, New York, New Jersey, California, Illinois, Alabama) to conduct Sharing Concerts.

This event aimed to raise awareness of Good Neighbors' activities and support children and residents in need across the globe. Throughout the year, 2,700 church members attended, supporting 575 children.
